To be eligible, a candidate must submit the following not later than THREE (3) months prior to the scheduled date of examination.

A. NEW APPLICANT (Graduated Year 2023):

- 1. Must be a member of the Philippine Medical Association.
- 2. Certificate attesting to being a diplomate of good standing of the Philippine College of Physicians.
- 3. Certificate of completion of fellowship (*Diploma*) in a PCCP accredited pulmonary fellowship training program.
- 4. Submit copy of completed research paper as required in the Standards and Requirements for Accreditation of Adult Pulmonary Medicine Fellowship Training Programs in the Philippines (April 2022).
- 5. Checklist summary of requirements for each Fellow-in-Training certified by the Training Officer.

B. RE-TAKERS:

- 1. Certificate attesting to being a diplomate of good standing of the Philippine College of Physicians.
- 2. Must be updated with PCCP membership dues.

C. APPLICANT UNDER THE LENIENCY PROGRAM:

- 1. Must be a member of the Philippine Medical Association.
- 2. Certificate attesting to being a diplomate of good standing of the Philippine College of Physicians.
- 3. In lieu of the completed research paper as a requirement, the PSBPM shall accept research related equivalents that the graduate have participated in and certified by the institution. These may include conducting clinical trials sponsored by local or national institutions, by international agencies as well as by the pharmaceutical industry; being an active member of Research Committees; being a member of Research Ethics Board; teaching research in the academe or medical institutions; conducting research workshops; and participating in the creation of clinical practice guidelines.
- 4. Certification from the Training Institution that the applicant has completed the requirements and eligible to take the diplomate exam. This document must be submitted to the PCCP through the PSBPM together with the diplomate exam application of the Associate Member.
